Students at 13 Guilford County schools will be back in the classroom **THIS WEDNESDAY**, **AUGUST 7**, **including a** *very different first day for students at GCS' newest magnet program.*

Allen Jay Middle students will get the red-carpet treatment when they arrive for the first day of school – literally. **At 7:45 a.m.,** a receiving line of school staff will greet the inaugural class of Allen Jay All-Stars with high-fives, cheers and camera flashes.

<u>It's all part of Allen Jay Middle's mission</u>, which combines a strong emphasis on leadership and college readiness with a high-energy teaching style using music and movement to keep students engaged. In its first year, the school will serve 110 fifth-graders in classrooms on the campus of Welborn Academy while renovations continue at Allen Jay Middle.

The cheers and chants will continue at **8:10 a.m.** with a morning rally featuring giveaways, music and more. **At 8:55 a.m.**, staff will spin the brightly colored "House Wheel" to induct students into one of four "houses," which will serve as their group or team during their years at Allen Jay.

Principal Kevin Wheat will be available to speak to media beginning at 7:30 a.m. and Superintendent Maurice "Mo" Green will be available at 9 a.m.
